

(From a letter written by Fra Giovanni on Christmas Eve, 1513)

I am your friend and my love for you goes deep. There is nothing I can give you which you have not got, but there is much, very much that while I cannot give it, you can take.

No heaven can come unless our hearts find rest in today. Take heaven! No peace lies in the future, which is not hidden, in this present

little instant. Take peace!

The gloom of the world is but a shadow. Behind it, yet within our reach is joy. There is radiance and glory in the darkness could we but see - and to see we have only to look. I beseech you to look!

Life is so generous a giver, but we, judging its gifts by the covering, cast them away as ugly, or heavy or hard. Remove the covering and you will find beneath it a living splendor, woven of love, by wisdom, with power.

Welcome it, grasp it, touch the angel's hand that brings it to you. Everything we call a trial, a sorrow, or a duty, believe me, that angel's hand is there, the gift is there, and the wonder of an overshadowing presence. Our joys, too, be not content with them as joys. They, too, conceal diviner gifts.

Life is so full of meaning and purpose, so full of beauty - beneath it's

covering - that you will find earth but cloaks your heaven.

Courage, then, to claim it, that is all. But courage you have, and the knowledge that we are all pilgrims together, wending through unknown country, home.

And so, at this Christmas time, I greet you. Not quite as the world sends greetings, but with profound esteem and with the prayer that for you now and forever, the day breaks, and the shadows flee away.

May we all rejoice in the birth of our Savior and may the Lord bless

all of you this most holy Christmas season.

## **Be Aware of Christmas Scammers**

Free gift cards: Nothing brings good cheer like the word "FREE." Scammers have been known to take advantage of this weakness by sending bulk phishing emails requesting personal information to receive free gift cards. In some of these emails, scammers impersonate legitimate companies and promise gift cards to reward their loyal customers. They may also use pop-up ads or send text mes-

sages with links saying you were randomly selected as the winner of a prize.

If you have received an unsolicited email with gift card offers, do not open it. Instead, mark it as spam or junk and delete it. However, if you opened the email, do not click on any links.

## **Donating IRA Assets to Charity**

Turn your required distributions into charitable donations.

IRS rules mandate that individuals age 70 1/2 and older take RMDs (Required Minimum Distributions) from their IRA each year, regardless of whether the income is needed. These annual withdrawals are subject to ordinary income taxes. By making a contribution from your IRA to the church or other charity, you can satisfy your RMD amount without reporting additional income.

This provision may be especially attractive for retirees who don't need all the income from their IRA to meet current living expenses. By donating the money to a charity, you can enjoy the satisfaction of knowing that you are contributing to a worthy cause while effectively lowering your tax bill.

#### How it works:

The provision allows retirees age 70 1/2 and older to donate up to \$100,000 tax

free from their IRA each year. Generally, when you take a distribution from your IRA, it is treated as taxable income. Under this provision, made permanent in the 2015 federal spending and tax package, those assets are excluded from income if the distribution is made directly to charity.

The distribution is not included in your income so you avoid the potential negative consequences that regular IRA withdrawals in retirement can create, including taxes on Social Security benefits. Normally, charitable contribution deductions are limited or are eliminated altogether for taxpayers who do not itemize deductions.

### Talk to your financial representative

It's important to consider your tax situation before deciding whether to make a charitable contribution from your IRA. Be sure to work closely with your financial advisor to determine whether this tax provision is right for you.

## **Altar Valley School District**

The Altar Valley School District is located in Three Points, AZ, which is about 25 miles west of downtown Tucson. Three Points, also known as Robles Junction, is a small, rural community (45 square miles) of about 5,000 residents.

The community is located adjacent to the Tohono O'odham Reservation, and is about 30 miles from the international border. The median household income is about

\$34,000 and nearly 28% of the population is below the poverty line. Most residents live in single-family or mobile homes.

The Altar Valley School district is vast, covering nearly 600 square miles in Pima County. Student enrollment is about 500 students between two school sites: Robles Elementary (Pre-K-5th grade) and Altar Valley Middle School (6th -8th grade).

## **Three Points Fire District Santa Shop**

TPFD collects new, unwrapped gifts for the community beginning each November. A Santa Shop is held in the bays at Station 303, in which community members in need can shop for their children. The list is started in November, The Shop works closely with the Altar Valley Schools to make sure families in need of help get the chance to participate. Two weeks before Christmas the District schedules appointments and each family can send one member to come in and shop choosing three gifts per child. They collect for infants through young adults; new,

unwrapped items are needed. Examples include; books, clothing, coloring books and crayons or colored pencils, blankets, toys, games, Barbies and accessories, remote control cars, legos, dolls, balls (Soccer, Football, Basketball), body care gift sets (Axe for boys, and for girls), earbuds, beanies, Baby toys (rattles, teethers, soft cars, etc.) gift cards (for teens—Amazon, Walmart), gas gift cards, fast food gift cards.

Santa also delivers gifts to families in need that do not have transportation, arriving by Firetruck.

# **Diaper Bank**

Fact: Over 25 million American adults suffer from incontinence.

In addition to diapers for babies, the Diaper Bank also provides incontinence and feminine hygiene products. Way focuses on adult products as there is a great need for adult products. The Holy Way is about the only organization in Tucson that provides adult products to the Diaper Bank of Southern Arizona. The Diaper Bank can make the dollar stretch much farther than any individual donation. For every one dollar donated, the Bank is able to purchase three dollars worth of product. If you wish to help continue this worthy cause, you can donate money (cash or check) or bring in adult incontinence products. Earmark your check or place cash in an envelope to: "Diaper Bank." Kathy can collect the funds. If you have adult products to donate, either bring them to the church or let Carol Portillo know—or contact Kathy in the office.

People who have Food Stamps cannot use them for feminine products.

There is a large box in the narthex where you can drop off products, or call Carol Portillo.

These shawls are always hand made (knit or crochet) while saying prayers for the recipients, never to be purchased, and donated by anyone who would like to keep our supply adequate to meet our needs. We encourage anyone interested to make and donate shawls.

The Prayer Shawl squares remain in the basket in the Narthex. Anyone desiring one can take their choice of the many colors available. These serve the same purpose as the prayer shawls, only more portable.
