


Per Capita

Each February 1st The Holy Way Presbyterian Church is required to send our church's Per Capita amount to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). **Each member** is responsible for their Per Capita amount. For 2023 we owed \$3,527.50, but we were unable to pay our per capita. For 2024 we owed \$3,945.60. We negotiated with the Presbytery and we paid \$2,000, but we only received \$1,569.28 from members; therefore, the \$430.72 deficit came from the church's general fund. So far for 2026 we have received \$225.00. **The Per Capita for each member of the church is \$43.90.** We realize that not everyone can afford their Per Capita amount. For those who are able to give a little more than your Per Capital, any fund over your amount would be appreciated.



Once a month a batch of donated food is given to Sells Presbyterian Church. Ten boxes were delivered in December.

The demand from food insecurity families has increased. Your generosity is much appreciated by the recipients. When you go food shopping, pick up a can or two extra for the Food Bank. Thank you for helping the Sells Presbyterian Church and community.

We keep a cabinet of food in the Ranch House that is available to our church members and anyone in the community who needs food.

Congregational Life Committee

This committee's ultimate goal is to promote fellowship. Fellowship is a word we throw out there without really thinking what fellowship means. One model is cited in Acts 2:42 — our friend "Al" explains fellowship as a close-knit community that shares their lives, support each other and as holding possessions in common to meeting needs.

Here's what Congregational Life has set up or planned so far this year:

- **Potlucks** three to four times a year. The first one this year was January 31, 2026.
- **Games**—we can plan on adding game time to the potlucks as well as restarting the monthly lunch and games. The times will be set to accommodate people who do not drive after dark or are still working during the week. Plan on **February 28** in the Ranch House at noon.
- Continue **Book Barn** trips. Dates and times to be announced. Brunch is also planned during these trips.
- There is **coffee hour** after service on the first and third Sundays every month—and the fifth Sunday when it occurs.
- We go out to eat at a restaurant after service on the second Sunday. Currently **Guerillmo's LL** is the restaurant we go to.
- The fourth Sunday is currently

designated as an "on your own," in which we encourage people to look around and invite people to join us, especially the newer members.

- The **prayer shawl** ministry is included in our activities. Anyone who would like a shawl or lap robe (for mental or physical health issues) can let Dee Ellis know.
- There are small **prayer shawl squares** in the Narthex for anyone who would like to have a portable pocket shawl is encouraged to take one.
- First-time visitor welcome bags with friendship bread is offered to all who attend church for the first time.

If there is interest, we are considering restarting the Men's monthly breakfast group as well as a women's monthly lunch gathering.

We encourage anyone who wishes to attend any activities but has a need to get transportation, to ask for this service. You can let the office know, or anyone on the Congregational Life Committee—Dee Ellis (520) 270-8367 is currently the committee's moderator.

Anyone interested in volunteering for this committee is welcome to meet with us the first Sunday each month after service.

Outreach/Mission Committee

This committee is under the leadership of Joe Riegert. He is always interested in having more volunteers for this very active committee. This committee meets the third Sunday after church service.

We are a Matthew 25 church (Matthew 25:31-46). This committee's policy and procedure document indicates "what we do matters to God and how we treat others matters."

Outreach Projects:

- **Food Pantry/Food Bank.** Our generous congregation donates food that is shared with people that need this service. This includes a monthly donation of food boxes to Sells (Papago Presbyterian Church).
- **Adult-Plus Products** to the Arizona Diaper Bank. We accept adult diapers and women's feminine hygiene products. For those who prefer to donate cash, for every \$1 donated the Diaper Bank can turn this into \$3 worth of product.
- **Way of Warmth.** Blankets and throws are collected from the Linus Project and other generous individuals and are distributed to organizations such as Ronald McDonald House, Papago Presbyterian Church and dialysis units.
- **Serena Project/First Responders.** Soft small toys are collected and distributed to various first responders to give to children involved in adverse domestic situations.
- **Three Points Relief** for the Disadvantaged. Donated gently used clothing in good repair is donated to Papago Presbyterian Church
- **McKinney Vento** program in the Three Points School System helps children who are homeless have what they need to remain in school. \$25 gift certificates to Walmart are welcome.
- **Thanksgiving Food Boxes.** Each November ten boxes of food for a complete Thanksgiving meal, including Turkeys, are presented to Vesey Elementary School.
- **Christmas Toys** for the Three Points Fire Department's Santa Shop are collected.
- **Back to School supplies** for the Three Points Schools are collected and distributed.

Mission Projects:

- **Trunk or Treat.** Each October volunteers meet in the church parking lot to dress up their trunks and pass out candy on the Saturday before Halloween.
- **Concert.** Astrid and Jesus favor us with a professional concert in the spring. Plan on attending in May. We give them an honorarium from the amount of funds that are donated at the concert.
- **Recital.** Astrid brings her students to our church in the spring. This is an afternoon of enjoyment. Plan on late April this year.

You can drop off your donations in the Narthex or in the Ranch House.

Tzedakah Box



Tzedakah (Tzeh-dah-KAH) is the Hebrew word that means *charity*. Some households will designate a container in which to place money. When the box is full, they give the container of money to a favorite charity or family in need.

Several years ago, our Mission Committee purchased a Tzedakah Box so that members and guests of our congregation can place money (coins or folded type) in it. The monies collected go toward supporting upcoming community events.

Since Covid 19 many people do not carry much cash with them. If you would like to support the Tzedakah box idea but do not have any cash burning a hole in your pocket, you can designate your monetary support by writing Tzedakah box on your check .
