

1 Corinthians 11:23-26

23 For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the *same* night in which He was betrayed took bread; **24** and when He had given thanks, He broke *it* and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is [e]broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

25 In the same manner *He* also *took* the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink *it,* in remembrance of Me."

26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.

"God's city: that image has long gathered to itself massive human hopes. Would that there were a city, with all the intensity and vigor of the great cities that have centered human life and attracted human imagination and made order out of the human experience of geography, but now whole, sheltering and welcoming all, healing, luminous with God's presence, with the Spirit of God. Such a city would be where God dwells.

To taste the meal is already to find oneself entering into the city. The exchange of the meal – we bring wretchedness and are given blessedness – is the commerce of the city. But is it for us?

Come to the table... Those who receive it become the very dwelling place of God. Where God dwells there is the city. Eat and drink. In the visible word, which is the bread and cup, you are gathered with all the redeemed little ones into the city of the Lamb." Gordon Lathrop
