They carry the spiritual energy of the person who crafts them, and can be used as a reminder of God's presence. They can be placed in a purse, backpack, pocket or car. Whenever you touch it, it serves as a reminder that someone has already prayed for you. They can be given as gifts to provide comfort, encouragement, and a sense of connection.

What is Per Capita? In essence: Per Capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that each congregation pays to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Said another way, it is a Presbyterian Covenant Community Fund—part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. Last year, The Holy Way's total Per Capita amount due was \$3,527.50. ## **Caution: Watch Out for Scammers!**

Scammers have been calling, sending emails and sending texts now more than ever!! They are hacking into phones, emails, and online accounts like FaceBook, Twitter, etc. Recently, Pastor Tina was even hacked!! We are including this information so you know what to look out for!

### Fake calls about your SSN

- The SSA will never (ever) call and ask for your Social Security number. It won't ask you to pay anything. And it won't call to threaten your benefits.
- Your caller ID might show the SSA's real phone number (1-800-772-1213), but that's not the real SSA calling.
- Never give your Social Security number to anyone who contacts you. Don't confirm the last 4 digits. And don't give a bank account or credit card number—ever—to anybody who contacts you asking for it.
- Remember that anyone who tells you to wire money, pay with a gift card, or send cash is a scammer. Always.

If you're worried about a call from someone who claims to be from the Social Security Administration, get off the phone. Then call the real SSA at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778). If you've spotted a scam, then tell the FTC at ftc.gov/complaint.

### **How to Recognize Phishing**

Scammers use email or text messages to trick you into giving them your personal information. They may try to steal your passwords, account numbers, or Social Security numbers..

Phishing emails and text messages often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment. They may:

- Say they've noticed some suspicious activity or longin attempts.
- Claim there's a problem with your account or your payment information.
- Say you must confirm some personal information.
- Include a fake invoice.
- Want you to click on a link to make a payment.
- Say you're eligible to register for a government refund
- Offer a coupon for free stuff
- Ask you to purchase gift cards on behalf of someone.

### **Report Phone Scams**

If you've lost money to a phone scam or have information about the company or scammer who called you, report it at:

If you didn't lose money and just want to report a call, you can use our streamlined reporting form at:

### **How to Report Phishing**

If you got a phishing email or text message, report it. The information you give can help fight the scammers.

**Step 1.** If you got a phishing email, forward it to the Anti-PhishingWorking Group at

reportphishing@apwg.org If you got a phishing text message, forward it to **SPAM (7726).** 

**Step 2.** Report the phishig attack to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov

### **Most Recent Scam Alerts:**

Scammers are impersonating FTC Chair Lina M. Khan in a new phishing scheme. The email says the FTC wants to send you Coronavirus relief funds and tells you to send some personal information, like your name, address, and date of birth. The FTC is not distributing Coronavirus economic stimulus or relief money to people. The email is a scam. Don't reply!

## **Phone Scams to Watch Out For:**

People lose a lot of money to phone scams—sometimes their life savings. they act friendly and helpful. In others, they might threaten or try to scare you.

### How to Recognize a **Phone Scam:**

### There is no prize

The caller might say you were "selected" for ah offer or that you've won a lottery. But if you have to pay to get the prize, it's not a prize.

#### You won't be arrested

Scammers might pretend to be law enforcement or a federal agency. They might say you'll be arrested or fined if you don't pay taxes or some other debt right away, but real law enforcement and federal agencies won't call and/or threaten you.

#### You don't need to decide now

Most legitimate businesses will give you time to think their offer over and get written information about it before asking you to commit. Take your time. Don't get pressured into making a decision on the spot.


### G-2.0301 Ruling Elder Defined

As there were in Old Testament times, elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life.

Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament (Pastor), exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships. When elected by the congregation, they shall serve faithfully as members of the session. When
